



JAMP Faculty Director Role

EXISTING JAMP STUDENTS

- Provide academic advising to all JAMP students and alternates. If not the official advisor for student or student is pursuing a degree in another academic department, work with their advisor to ensure student is on appropriate path to meet JAMP requirements of earning bachelor's degree in four years.
- Assist JAMP students and alternates to set needed classes and recommend faculty when possible.
- Meet with JAMP students on monthly basis, if not more often, to discuss current performance in courses. Identify academic and non-academic support for JAMP students as needed.
- Create JAMP group or incorporate JAMP students into existing organization with frequent meetings to allow JAMP students to come together for discussions and presentations. This will promote collaboration among JAMP students and feeling of “community” especially on larger campuses.
- Following summer programs, meet with JAMP students to discuss evaluation comments and determine any necessary steps for improvement.
- Coordinate with JAMP Medical School Coordinators (MSCs) to follow progress of MCAT preparation including completion of full length tests following summer internship

PRE-JAMP STUDENTS

- Identify Pre-JAMP students during freshman year through orientation, financial aid award searches, interest in pre-med activities, majors, etc.
- Identified students who express an interest in participating in JAMP are entitled to the following assistance:
 - Regular meetings with the JFD to monitor the students' academic progress and advise the students in academic course work and career choices
 - Tutoring in courses as necessary to be paid with program funds
- Include Pre-JAMP students in JAMP student group activities so they can feel they are a part of something
- Organize (or have JAMP students organize) visits to your campus from regionally assigned MSC and/or JAMP medical school students.
- Coordinate with MSC to organize trip for selected Pre-JAMP students to attend a symposium at regionally assigned medical school.
